

WICOMICO COUNTY, MARYLAND

BRIEF ECONOMIC FACTS



Wicomico County, on Maryland's Eastern Shore, borders the Chesapeake Bay on the west and Delaware on the north. Wicomico County is the commercial/industrial center of the Lower Eastern Shore, drawing shoppers and business from Delaware, Virginia and nearby Maryland counties. Salisbury is the region's transportation and industrial center. Educational needs are served by Salisbury University, Wor-Wic Community College and the University of Maryland Eastern Shore.

Wicomico's 2,720 businesses employ 40,200 workers: an estimated 60 of these businesses have 100 or more workers. Major employers are Delmarva Power, Harvard Custom Manufacturing, Cadista Pharmaceuticals, K&L Microwave, MaTech, Peninsula Regional Medical Center, Perdue Farms, Powerwave Technologies, Standard Register and Tishcon.

Wicomico County has two State Enterprise Zones, one in Salisbury and one in Fruitland.

BUSINESS/INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY

Northwood Industrial Park, in the Salisbury area, has a total of 350 acres with 50 acres available.

Air Business Center (ABC) has direct runway access to sites for air related corporate use. Long term land leases are available.

Fruitland Industrial Park has a total of 110 acres with municipal service and rail access.

Westwood Commerce Park, at the intersection of U.S. Route 50 and the new Bypass, offers 260 acres served by Salisbury city water and sewer, as well as natural gas and high speed voice and data lines.

TRANSPORTATION

Highways: U.S. 13 and U.S. 50.

Rail: Norfolk Southern Railroad.

Truck: 25 motor freight common carriers serve the county.

Water: Wicomico River, 14 ft. channel at Salisbury. Salisbury Port is the second largest in Maryland. Also served by the Port of Baltimore, 50' channel; a leading U.S. automobile and break-bulk port; six public terminals including the state-of-the-art Intermodal Container Transfer Facility.

Air: USAirways Express serves the Salisbury-Ocean City-Wicomico Regional Airport, 4.5 miles east of Salisbury; full instrument landing system, A & E repair, aviation fuel, and avionics repair. The airport has daily air service to/from Philadelphia and Charlotte. Several air freight companies have facilities at the airport, including Federal Express; and UPS has a regional facility in Salisbury.

UTILITIES

Electricity: Delmarva Power and Choptank Electric Cooperative, Inc. Customers of investor-owned utilities and major cooperatives may choose their electric supplier.

Gas: Natural gas supplied by Chesapeake Utilities Corporation.

Water: Municipal systems in Delmar, Fruitland, Hebron, Pittsville, Salisbury, Sharptown and Willards.

Sewer: Municipal systems in Delmar, Fruitland, Hebron, Pittsville, Salisbury, Sharptown, Willards and Air Business Center.

Telecommunications: Local Carriers - Verizon Maryland and other local provider(s) that offer service on proprietary or leased infrastructure. Long Distance Carriers - AT&T, Verizon, Sprint and numerous additional carriers and resellers of WATS and MTS. AT&T, Verizon and Sprint POPs located in Salisbury.

RECREATION and CULTURE

Leisure time pursuits are: swimming; fishing—including deep sea fishing; boating; golfing; skeet, trap and silhouette shooting; hiking, biking, canoeing birdwatching; and country and yacht club activities.

Five state parks provide camping and natural beauty.

A variety of entertainment options exist through summer band, big band, and rock music concerts; national country western shows; the Salisbury Symphony; and dinner theater plays. A Council of Arts serves the area, as does the largest civic center on the Delmarva Peninsula.

Sports fans enjoy collegiate athletic events, tennis and professional golf tournaments. Horse racing (trotting) occurs at Ocean Downs. A Hunt Club/Pony Club provides additional recreational activities.

Places and events of interest include a Wildlife Museum (and World Carving Show); antique auto clubs and shows; tours of historic homes; and a first-class zoo.

The Dogwood Spring Festival and Seafood Festival are annual events.

Wicomico County is home to the Delmarva Shorebirds, a Class A minor league affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles.
