

### ***T. Jan Wiseman background***

Mr. Wiseman has been executive director of the Greater Salisbury Committee since 2002 when he came here from a senior administrative position at the American Soybean Association in St. Louis.

His more than 25 years of association and business-related leadership include executive vice president positions at the Apartment Association of Metro Denver, the Professional Insurance Agents of Colorado, the American Society of Farm Managers and Rural Appraisers, and the president of the Professional Development Institute. He also was staff vice president for the Farm and Land Institute of the National Association of Realtors in Chicago.

As a college dean for 12 years in Illinois, Mr. Wiseman created and developed distance learning centers and community-based education that accounted for more than 50% of the college's enrollment and which received several national and state awards for innovation.

While a professional journalist as an editor at newspapers in Rockford, Ill., and Green Bay, Wis., Mr. Wiseman was the vice president of the Society of Professional Journalists, Northern Illinois Professional Chapter. Professional awards he has received include an Innovation in Government Award from the Denver Regional Council of Governments, the Affiliate Executive of the Year from the National Apartment Association, and the Executive of the Year from the Colorado Society for Association Executives.

In Salisbury, he currently chairs the Shepherds Board at SonLife Community Church. Hebron. Prior, he chaired the board of directors of Goodwill Industries of Metro Denver, a \$13 million non-profit serving the disabled and disadvantaged for the world of work and co-created SWAT (Social Weapons and Tactics) which brought together law enforcement, the apartment industry, and non-profits to fight gangs and drug trafficking in the Denver metro area.

Mr. Wiseman received a bachelor's degree in journalism/science from the University of Wisconsin-Madison; and both a master's in journalism and education, and a CAS degree in adult education from Northern Illinois University, plus the certified association executive designation from the American Society of Association Executives in Washington, DC.
